YiP in 2024

- Program information and webforms all online – **lmcf.org.au/yip**
- **Student committees to choose not-for-profit organisations** from pre-approved list, based on the Impact Area selected.
- **Student committees organise their not-for-profit organisation visits** which can be online meeting or visit.
- **\$10,000** grants budget allocated to each student committee, with an option for additional **\$2,500 match funding from Foundation through school fundraising.**



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Eligibility Criteria

Endorsed as a Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) as covered by Item 1 of the table section in 30-15 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

Endorsed as a Tax Concession Charity (TCC).

Registered with Australian Charities and Not-for-Profit Commission (acnc.gov.au).

Exclusions – Grants are not provided for:

- Clinical research projects
- Endowment funds
- Retrospective funding
- Recurrent expenditure where there is no plan in place for long-term sustainability of project or program
- Auspicing



Criteria to Assess Grants

- Is it a good strategic fit?
- Does the project align with the Impact Area?
- Will it promote equity and equality?
- Is it based on sound evidence?
- How many people will benefit from the project?
- Does it involve sound community engagement principles?
- Does the project or idea have potential for scale?
- Does it promote sustainability – environmental and/or financial sense?
- Does the project involve a partnership or collaboration?



Criteria to Assess Grants

- What is the social need?
- Community and/or organisational needs clear?
- Target demographic clearly identified?
- Good planning
 - clear project plan?
- Are the objectives clearly outlined with the outcomes?
- How will the outcomes be measured?
- Is the project good value for the funds requested?
- Does the organisation receive government funding?
